"STUFF" YOU MAYBE WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT THE MIDWEST REGION but didn't want to ask!

National Council of Corvette Clubs, Inc. (NCCC) was incorporated in 1960 and is the world's largest non-profit Corvette organization. Today it is a nationwide group of just under 300 clubs with a 1997 renewal of approximately 11,000 members. NCCC presently has 15 active "Regions" including the MIDWEST REGION which covers Illinois, Minnesota and Wisconsin. Made of up of 29 Clubs, it is the third largest Region in NCCC with a 1997 membership of almost 1,200 Primary, Spouse and Dependent members.

There are many reasons why Clubs and their members choose to be affiliated with NCCC:

- its sanctioning program for competitive events of various types
- its fund raising activities for various charities
- ♦ its participation in the National Corvette Museum Foundation
- ♦ its annual fun-filled Conventions held from Palm Beach to Orlando to Cleveland to St. Louis
- its top-notch quarterly magazine entitled Blue Bars
- ♦ its insurance program for Clubs that covers competitive as well as meetings and social events
- ♦ the benefits to a Club and its members goes on and on . . . the list is too long!

Each affiliated Club has one representative to NCCC. This person, known as the "Governor", is responsible for all paperwork for any competition events the Club hosts as well as any paperwork for NCCC membership. Your NCCC Governor usually does not live in a mansion in your state capitol. The Governor is <u>your</u> link to NCCC by attending both National and Regional Meetings and advising you of issues and activities. You should encourage him or her to attend these valuable meetings.

MIDWEST REGION PARTY – The annual Midwest Region Party is on Saturday, March 8th at the Route 66 Cafe/William Tell Holiday Inn Complex in Countryside IL. Check out the flyer printed in this Regional newsietter! Part of the program that night will be recognition and awards for the 1996 Midwest Region competition season. If you earn 200 points or more in a competition year, you receive a "points" place award at this annual Regional Party. At a later date, these same men and women receive a NCCC jacket patch showing their Regional placement. Participants in the 1996 Midwest Region Championship Series held in September will also be receiving awards and recognition. Read on further to learn how you can earn "points" and also how to "qualify" to be invited to the next Championship Series.

SANCTIONED EVENTS – Elsewhere in this newsletter is the 1997 Midwest Region Sanctioned Event Schedule. Listed below is a brief description of the types of competitive events that are on this schedule. For information on the other types that are not on our Region Schedule, see your NCCC Rulebook. There are seven (7) basic types of NCCC Sanctioned Events with the Speed Event and Rallye types being further divided into other categories.

SPEED EVENTS:

AUTOCROSS — a speed event where a course is set up using pylons and/or a track. Cars race against the clock, not wheel to wheel. Designed to test driving skills. The course is less than one (1) mile in length. Can be low or high speed — see note after MT.

TIME TRIAL — An Autocross where the course is over one (1) mile in length, such as long road courses. MATCHING TIMES (MT) — a timed run on an autocross course for consistency. The course is less than one (1) mile in length.

Note: A Low Speed Event is one in which the maximum obtainable speed by any Group I-S, I or II car is less than 80 mph; a Novice Class is available for those with little or no experience. See your Rulebook for High Speed Event regulations including driver certification, roll bars, fire extinguishers, etc.

RALLYE -- a competitive automobile run over public roads and under ordinary traffic rules. Both a driver and navigator are required. There are three basic types of Rallyes: Gimmick, Chance (poker, hare & hounds, etc.), Time-Speed-Distance (TSD).

FUNKHANA -- a timed contest for cars designed to test skills; gimmicks are used on an Autocross-like course. Both a driver and navigator are required.

CONCOURS -- a showing of Corvettes in which the entries are judged for cleanliness and workmanship. Clubs can also sanction the popular "People's Choice" type Concours where entrants and spectators vote for their favorite car in each class.

REGIONAL POINTS -- The competition events that are listed on the Midwest Region Event Schedule are sanctioned by NCCC and are, therefore, run in accordance with the NCCC Rulebook. Sanctioned events are also sometimes referred to as "points" events. "Points" are accumulated throughout the competition season (Jan. 1/Dec. 15). If you enter at least five (5) events in a year, your name and points total appear on the Regional Points Standing in a "place" according to the number of points earned.

All NCCC members can earn individual "points" at sanctioned events in the following ways:

- You earn "points" if you participate in a Corvette or as a worker and are a current NCCC member.
- You can earn from 2 to 9 points according to class placement in the event.
- Chairperson/Co-Chairperson can earn 9 points for one event a year.
- Workers earn 2 points if they are not an entrant in the event.
- ♦ As an entrant, you earn travel points for one event per day if the Host Club is 200 miles or more from your Club's declared "home city". One (1) point is also earned for each 100 miles over the first 200 up to a maximum of 9 points (example: >300 miles = 3 travel points). If you live more than fifty (50) miles from your Club's home city, your travel points will be calculated from your home; ask your Governor to place your name on the RCD's "50+ Mileage Sheet" each year.

NCCC Clubs also earn "points" that are tabulated for the Club Points Standing. Your Club earns points in the following ways:

- Each time you enter or work an event that is hosted by another NCCC Club, your Club earns an equal number of points, including travel points.
- ◆ For each NCCC sanctioned event that your Club hosts, instead of points equal to what its members eam as entrants or workers, the Club earns 100 points. Seven sanctioned events can be hosted by a NCCC Club each year for a total of 700 points.

The top placing Club in the Region hosts the Region Party the next year, receives an award and each member of that Club receives a commemorative jacket patch from NCCC.

QUALIFYING FOR MIDWEST REGION CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES — (If the Series is not held in any particular year, this information would also apply to earning the participation patch.) The events listed on the Midwest Region Event Schedule are the events used to accumulate "points" towards qualifying. Your individual "qualifying-points" are accumulated from January 1st through September 14th. (Note: the last day to qualify changes every year.) In addition to the number of points required to qualify in each event type, you must enter a minimum of five (5) events of any type during that time period. Remember no travel, worker or Chairperson points count toward qualifying; you may receive one event participant credit for the event in which you were Chairperson or Co-Chairperson. You may qualify in more than one class in Concours or Speed but must declare only one class when registering to participate in the Championship Series events. Points needed to qualify for the types of events are:

CONCOURS -- the points must all be earned in the same class; the number of points varies according to class. (Wash & Show - 12 points; Street Show - 16 points; Concours Prepared, Modified, Custom or Race Prepared - 20 points)

RALLYE -- 12 points -- both driver and navigator must be qualified

SPEED EVENT - 25 points - the points must all be earned in the same class. Points for a Matching Times count only if held in conjunction with a Speed Event. (Funkhanas and Drags do not count.)

Don't forget -- your Governor receives flyers for all Midwest Region sanctioned events -- hope to see you out and about this year! Renew old friendships -- make some new ones! Have some fun with those 'Vettes with a lot of other great Corvette people! I've read the articles and Internet info, looked at all the "real" and "spy" pictures, seen Motor Trend's road test on TV and can hardly wait to see a real, live Sebring Silver '97! I really like it -- how about you?

WHAT IS FCOA? FUTURE CORVETTE OWNERS ASSOCIATION is the youth organization of National Council of Corvette Clubs. FCOA started at the Charlotte Convention in 1991 as an effort to instill and then maintain an interest in Corvetting within the younger generation. Its present membership is made up of 290 kids from 6 months to just a shade under 16 years old who live all over the United States.

WHY IS FCOA IMPORTANT? By creating an excitement about our favorite car, it is hoped that the FCOA members will go on to becoming active NCCC members. After all, isn't this the generation that will be NCCC's future? FCOA is the link to NCCC's 21st Century! Things have been pretty quiet in FCOA for a few years but I hope to be able to make it a great program for the kids once again.

WHO CAN JOIN FCOA? Membership is open to immediate family members of current NCCC members. The "kid" can be your child or grandchild but must be under the age of 16. The Midwest Region currently has 31 FCOA members & -- really not very many for the third largest Region in NCCC! My goal in 1997 is to bring FCOA's membership up to 500 nationwide and I thought my own Region was a good place to start! There is a membership application in each issue of Blue Bars -- fill one out for each kid or grandkid, pay the one-time \$5 dues (such a deal!) and they're "in"!

We have already gotten off to a great start for 1997 with Mid America Designs as a new sponsor and an unusual "fund raiser" with the sale of the first Corvette book written for kids. 




